N.O. Woman Honored
for 5 Sons in Service

Mrs. Louis J. Garic, who was honored in 1944 by Our Lady of Lourdes Church Parish for having five sons serving in World War II, died Thursday at the age of 86.

Mrs. Garic, who lost one son, **Roland Garic**, in action, was honored for having the greatest number of sons in the service at one time.

The former Inola Marie DeRouen, she was born and reared on a New Iberia plantation. She was educated at a New Iberia convent. Following her marriage, she moved to New Orleans.

Mrs. Garic died at her home at 4776 Charlene dr.

She is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Pedro Aleman and Mrs. Anzelmo Kurgan; three sons, Burns, Harold, and Ory Garic; a sister, Mrs. W. M. Davidson; 10 grandchildren and one great-grandson.
